



Uyghur Forced Labor Prevention Act (UFLPA) Compliance Statement

The UFLPA prohibits the importation of goods made in the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region of the People's Republic of China ("XUAR") based on the presumption that all goods made in the region are made with forced labor.

The Act establishes a rebuttable presumption that the importation of any goods, wares, articles, and merchandise mined, produced, or manufactured wholly or in part XUAR or produced by certain entities which are in the UFLPA entity list, is prohibited by 19 U.S.C. 1307 ([U.S.C. Title 19 - CUSTOMS DUTIES \(govinfo.gov\)](https://www.gpo.gov/edac/pubs/title19/customs.html)) and that such goods, wares, articles, and merchandise are not entitled to entry to the United States. U.S. Customs and Border Protection ("CBP") released its first set of guidance relating to the UFLPA, which goes into effect on June 21, 2022.

The presumption applies unless the Commissioner of U.S. CBP determines there is an exception through clear and convincing evidence, that the goods, wares, articles, or merchandise were not produced using forced labor or that UFLPA does not apply.

Concerning the requirements of UFLPA, we hereby certify that the products supplied by NorComp are not produced wholly or in part in China's Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region or produced by certain entities which are in the UFLPA entity list. This declaration is solely based on the information collected from our suppliers and manufacturing facilities.
